1. Essential Survival Kit for New GPs – Tuesday 4 July 2017

2. IR35

From 6 April changes to the legislation known as IR35 mean that National Insurance and tax deductions for some locums will now be payable at source **by the practice**. This is likely to apply if a locum is working regular hours with the practice through an agency. Locums working as sole traders are unlikely to be affected. It is the responsibility of the employing practice or the locum agency to decide whether to apply IR 35 legislation to the employment. <u>A tool</u> and further guidance is available on the HMRC website to help practices and locums in making this assessment.

3. NHS Standard Hospital Contract – Changes 2016/2017

NHS England has accepted a number of changes for the new NHS Standard Contract, most notably:

- Results of investigations requested by hospital clinicians should be communicated by the hospital directly to patients.
- Hospitals should directly liaise with patients should they miss an outpatient appointment rather than ask GPs to re-refer.
- Hospitals should make direct internal referrals to another department or clinician for a related medical problem rather than send the patient back to the GP for a new referral.

The changes are designed to further reduce inappropriate workload on GP practices, and also improve patient care across the primary/secondary care interface. Read the details <u>here</u>. Practices should feedback any secondary care issues to their locality commissioning lead and copy in their <u>LMC</u> so that it is aware of any trends which should be taken up with the CCG at its regular liaison meetings.

4. 17/18 GP contract changes - Indemnity

17/18 GP contract changes negotiated by the BMA have resulted in an additional £30 million being paid by NHSE to help practices cover the rising cost of indemnity fees. This is paid directly to practices on a per patient basis and is intended to benefit salaried and locum GPs as well as partners. Practices, therefore, should ensure that salaries/agreements with their locums reflect this. Locum GPs should ensure their invoices are uplifted appropriately to take account of this.

5. GP retentions scheme

The <u>GP retentions scheme</u>, which LLMC Medical Director Dr Vicky Weeks helped negotiate as a member of the BMA's Sessional GPs' subcommittee, aims to address the problem of retaining GPs by focussing on the support and flexibility that GPs may need in the various stages of their career.

The scheme supports both the retained GP and the practice employing them by offering financial support in recognition of the fact that this role is different to a 'regular' part-time, salaried GP post, offering greater flexibility and educational support. Doctors who are interested in applying to the scheme should contact their HEE Scheme Lead who will be able to advise on their eligibility for the scheme. See details of the scheme <u>here</u>.
