1. LMC Elections 2018 – Speaking up for general practice

Would you like to make your voice heard and speak up for general practice in Hillingdon? This year, for the first time, all LMC seats are up for election. There are 12 places available for a 2-year term on Hillingdon Local Medical Committee.

Who is suitable for this role? Any GP working in Hillingdon willing to represent Hillingdon GPs, whether partner, employed, locum, new entrant or trainee. New talent is especially welcome.

Nomination packs are available at <u>www.ersvotes.com/londonwidelmcs</u>. **The deadline for submitting your nomination is 5.00pm, Friday 1 June 2018.** This should include the names of two supporting GPs in Hillingdon.

2. Amended Medical Interoperability Gateway/ISA

The LMC wrote to you before Easter recommending you not to sign the amended MIG/ISA. This was because the MIG/ISA had been amended to allow the retrospective and prospective sharing of free-text.

The LMC is concerned that the sharing of retrospective free text written under the protection of the original ISA may not be legal and we have asked the CCG to confirm if it has sought a legal opinion. We are awaiting a response.

You are advised, therefore,

- Not to share retrospective free text until the legality of doing so has been established
- To ask the CCG to prevent any retrospective free text from being shared under the new MIG ISA until the legality of doing so has been established

4. Invoicing local authority for reports

With practice resources more tightly squeezed than ever, Londonwide LMCs has been campaigning for GP practices to be reimbursed for obligatory work requested by the Local Authority but not funded through the NHS contract. Londonwide LMCs has now written to LAs across the capital reminding them of their obligation to pay for work requested. 6. Primary Care Support England (PCSE) service failures – compensation claims

Services provided by PCSE (through Capita since September 2015) have been an ongoing source of frustration to practices with issues ranging from delays in the transfer of medical records to tardy processing of pension contributions and GP payments. Where practices or individual GPs have suffered loss as a result of failings in these services, they are entitled to be compensated. See the BMA website <u>for how to claim</u> and click on 'case escalation for practice payments or losses'

Housing Applications

Patients DO NOT require a letter of recommendation from their GP to support housing applications. <u>Housing</u> <u>Application Guidance</u> is available on Londonwide LMCs' website to help patients understand this, and to push back on unnecessary work for GPs.
