Services provided by PCSE (through Capita since September 2015) have been an ongoing source of frustration to practices with issues ranging from delays in the transfer of medical records to tardy processing of pension contributions and GP payments. Where practices or individual GPs have suffered loss as a result of failings in these services, they are entitled to be compensated. ### 4. Local authority reports and letters reimbursement under collaborative arrangements

Dr Elliott Singer, Medical Director at Londonwide LMCs, recently wrote to the local authorities (LAs) in the 27 London boroughs covered by Londonwide LMCs to raise the issue of practices not being reimbursed for work done for LAs in the fields of education, social services and public health. Practices have an obligation to do this work under 'collaborative arrangements', but it is not part of their NHS contract and therefore needs to be resourced by the LA requesting a report, letters, etc. Template letters and forms for practices can be downloaded here:
