1. Sutton LMC- what have we been doing for you?

At the recent LMC meetings members have discussed key strategic and operational issues and recent developments with the CCG.

Issues discussed included:

- Sutton CCG's Primary Care commissioning Intentions
- Extended Access.
- Suttons CCG's GP Forward View plans
- Service Specification for Public Health, Sexual Health

There have also been several meetings with the CCG and NHSEL with regard to the PMS contract review and these are continuing.

The LMC has also recently met with the London Borough of Sutton Public Health colleagues to discuss the Sexual Health services specification.

2. Sutton LMC calls for Sessional GPs

Sutton LMC acts for all NHS GPs working within Sutton, not only supporting them, but also representing their views to other agencies. With the recent plethora of reorganisations within the NHS, coupled with lack of funding and increased pressures put upon GPs, LMC representation is needed more than ever. One of the core values of the LMC is equity and fairness. Sessional GPs (whether salaried or locums) are often under-represented on the LMCs.

3. GP Contract changes for 17/18- indemnity fees

Details of the contract changes for 17/18 can be accessed <u>here</u>. One of the key elements relates to an additional £30m which will be added to practice budgets based on a per patient basis and not weighted. This is intended to cover the increase in indemnity costs for all GPs working in the practice including salaried GPs. As this money will be paid directly to practices GP Partners should ensure that the appropriate amount of funding reaches their salaried GP colleagues. Locum GPs will need to ensure that the invoices/agreements with practices are uplifted appropriately to take account of this business expense.

4. Prospective Employers requests to see copies of appraisal summaries

It has come to Londonwide LMCs' attention that some prospective employers have been asking candidates to share with them their appraisal summary. The LLMC view supported by colleagues on the GPC, is that this is unacceptable practice. GP appraisal documentation is highly privileged information with restricted access for specific purposes only, relating to the Medical Register, Licensing and Performers' list requirements.

Knowing that one's appraisal might be used as evidence for a future interview could potentially undermine the benefits of self-reflection and transparency and therefore the purpose of appraisal as a developmental tool.

It is reasonable that the potential employer requests evidence of regular appraisal and date of revalidation and this could be the screen shot of the appraisal page on Clarity that shows appraisal dates.

5. GPC sessional Sub-Committee survey

The BMA GPC Sessional Sub-Committees recently undertaken its first survey for salaried and locum GPs since 2010. The results of this important survey will be made available to practices in due course.

6. New LLMC Practice mergers guidance
