1. Welcome to new LMC members

Londonwide LMCs' election process is now complete and our new LMC members Rishav Dhital, Sudeshna Sarkar and Rameet Singh Uberoi have joined our returning members for the two-year term.

2. Farewell to departing members

Waltham Forest LMC said farewell to Dr Dapinder Rattan. We thank you for your dedication and contributions to Waltham Forest LMC and send our best wishes to you for the future.

3. COVID Exemptions

There is an NHS process for Covid exemptions; the patient has an initial 119 discussion and (if it is thought they may be exempt) is given a form to send to the GP. The GP then reviews for a medical exemption and enters this on the SCR. See [Summary Care Record application \(SCRa\) COVID-19 Exemptions Information - NHS Digital](#).

There is a payment for this, which is for the work whether the GP deems the patient exempt or not. See [COVID-19 vaccination exemptions - COVID-19: toolkit for GPs and GP practices - BMA](#) for more details.

4. Barts Health – GP pressures and how we can help

The five NEL LMC Chairs recently wrote to acute trusts inviting mutual working to manage patient expectation. Professor Alistair Chesser, Group Chief Medical Officer has sent a statement to all Barts Health consultants to share understanding of general practice experiences and encouraging active support for GP colleagues.

5. Unified GP Voice in Waltham Forest

The LMC is working with FedNet and the PCN CDs to establish a unified voice in Waltham Forest, which will participate in local partnerships and contribute to the Integrated Care Partnerships borough-based boards within NEL ICS.

General practice in the borough is developing a Memorandum of Understanding to create an agreed framework for all parties to work together in relation to delivering integrated primary care, physical health, social care and mental health services.

6. Mandatory Covid vaccinations for NHS staff

Waltham Forest members raised this issue at the LMC and heard that, if practices have staff who have not had Covid vaccination, it is important to have and record formal conversations about the implications. Regulations to make full vaccination a condition of deployment have been passed into law. First doses need to be received by 3 February in order for second doses to be received by 31 March. Further guidance was published on 14 January. Vaccination as a condition for deployment (VCOD) applies to all members of the primary care team, which includes non-clinical colleagues. A practice will need to consider any opportunities for deployment but in a general practice setting these are likely to be limited. In the absence of such an opportunity, the practice will need to consider if the colleague will need to be dismissed on 1 April 2022. The BMA will be producing a FAQ which will hopefully explain this in more detail.

7. Income protection

LIS/LES income protection has been agreed for Quarter 3 and Quarter 4, where the temporary payment arrangements will be in place until 31 March. The anticipation is that from Friday 1 April LIS and LES payments will be paid on achievement and we will update on any changes.

8. Advice & Guidance

The LMC is in discussions with Barts Health and the CCG in relation to the Advice & Guidance. Concerns have been raised and the intention is to ensure the future rollout of services will have accompanying pathways with appropriate systems to assist.

9. Beam to LMC App

Beam to LMC is a mobile app to help hard-pressed GPs and practice teams to highlight the pressure they are under from commissioners and others by taking control of their workload and sharing those requests in real time. Click on the link for more details to [Beam to LMC](#)

10. Winter Access Fund

Practices identified as being in the bottom 20% of access data will be asked to discuss this with the CCG with a view to supporting improvement; the LMC has secured agreement that an LMC representative can attend these meetings. Londonwide LMCs is also in discussions with the CCG about issues with the data overall.

There is another element of the Winter Access Fund available to any practice, conditional on participation in the Community Pharmacy Consultation Scheme and increasing access. This money is paid in arrears if compliance with the conditions is demonstrated after the additional work has been done; Londonwide LMCs has advised practices to consider carefully the details of the scheme before signing up. The CCG is still approaching practices that have not yet said whether they are interested.

11. NEL Integrated Care System

The North East London ICS is due to replace NEL CCG later this year, where local authorities, acute trusts and community providers will work together with primary care to provide health and care in local communities. The replacement date has recently been postponed from April to July.

Zina Etheridge has been announced as the ICS Chief Executive and further appointments are expected as the ICS begins to take shape.

Partnerships and boards are being established at NEL level, which will include the three sub-systems: Tower Hamlets, Newham and Waltham Forest (TNW); Barking, Havering and Redbridge (BHR); and City & Hackney. The LMC is working to secure a strong place for general practice in these emerging structures.

12. NEL LIS Equalisation Programme

North East London ICS will be seeking to equalise the funding for around 150 LIS schemes across NEL, which will be reviewed over a three-year programme, and prioritised by local need.

Safeguarding, phlebotomy and the duty doctor scheme are the first three services to be looked at and will be followed by mental health and diabetes. Each review will be carried out by a task and finish group with LMC representation. Dr Grenville, the LMC's Chair, was appointed to the phlebotomy task and finish group and is pushing to secure meaningful participation.

13. Your LMC and YOU

We now have a newly-elected LMC keen to connect with GPs across the area. As a local GP you have a unique insight into General Practice in your neighbourhood.

Working in General Practice is harder than ever; we have all suffered stress, strain and loss in recent times. However, there is no-one better suited than grass-roots GPs to highlight the pressures on our practices, patients and colleagues. Together we can continue to find solutions, to safeguard our profession.

England LMC Conference

Here is a sample of resolutions from the recent England LMC Conference:

NHSE Access Plan

That conference rejects the NHSE plan for improve access for patients supporting general practice published on 14th October 2021, will not accept the money and will not comply with the stipulations therein.

Integrated Care Systems (ICS)

That conference recognised that GP representation in the new Integrated Care Systems is unclear and variable and demands that GPC England negotiate with NHSEI that:

- (i) all Integrated Care Systems should outline how they will enable LMCs to carry out their statutory role
- (ii) there should be no mandated limit on the number of general practice representatives on both NHS and Place Boards and general practice alone should decide who represents them within an ICS
- (iii) national funding for GPs roles in system and place leadership be made available
- (iv) funding must be ring fenced for enhanced services that are currently commissioned from general practice through locally commissioned services
- (v) where collaboration and streamlining of pathways involves work transferring to general practice from secondary care, funding and resource follows from funding previously aligned to secondary care budgets.
