1. Message from the Chair- Dr Penelope Jarrett

Lambeth LMC remains acutely aware of the workload, staffing and financial pressures facing general practice.

This is reflected in the November 2016 Workforce Survey undertaken by Londonwide LMCs.

LMC members remain committed to engaging with the CCG and challenging where necessary, the commissioning of services that could negatively impact on GP practices.

We remain aware that many of you are concerned about the local impact of the SE London STP and this will be reflected in ongoing discussion between the LMC and the CCG.

PMS contract review discussions continue to progress with the CCG and NHSEL whilst remaining cognisant of the need for equalisation to GMS contract holders. The LMC stands firm that practices should have sufficient reading before deciding whether to accept the new PMS offer; NHSEL maintain that the start date of the new contracts should be 1 October 2017 and so timelines remain extremely challenging.

We will continue to monitor the GPFV funding streams and challenge the CCG to ensure as much as possible passes directly to practice to enhance resilience during a period of great change.

Please ensure we can work effectively for you by keeping your contact details up-to-date and sharing our newsletter widely within your practice, particularly sessional and salaried doctors.

4. Lambeth LMC calls for Sessional GPs

Lambeth LMC acts for all NHS GPs working within Lambeth, not only supporting them, but also representing their views to other agencies. With the recent plethora of re-organisations within the NHS, coupled with lack of funding and increased pressures put upon GPs, LMC representation is needed more than ever. One of the core values of the LMC is equity and fairness. Sessional GPs (whether salaried or locums) are often under-represented on the LMCs.

5. Friends and Family Test

For practices who use MJog you could have access to a Friends and Family Test system which provides clear reporting for NHSE. Simply go to the MJog homepage, log on to your MJog account and enter 'Friends and Family Test set-up' in to the 'How can we help' box. You will then be run-through a simple process to set up a Friends and Family Test facility for your practice. Once you have set up simply go to your MJog homepage, click on 'view Friends and Family results' where you will then have the option to filter results by month using the drop down.

New LLMC Practice mergers guidance

This guidance is to make GPs and their practices aware of what needs to be taken into account when considering a merger with another practice (or practices). It is a summary of some basic issues that practices need to be aware of and address in their exploratory discussions with the other practice(s)- This can be accessed here.

6. GP Contract changes for 17/18- indemnity fees

Details of contract changes for 17/18 can be accessed here. One of the key elements relates to an additional £30m which will be added to practice budgets based on a per patient basis and not weighted. This is intended to cover the increase in indemnity costs for all GPs working in the practice including salaried GPs. As this money will be paid directly to practices GP Partners should ensure that the appropriate amount of funding reaches their salaried GP colleagues. Locum GPs will need to ensure that the invoices/agreements with practices are uplifted appropriately to take account of this business expense.

7. Prospective Employers requests to see copies of appraisal summaries

It has come to Londonwide LMCs' attention that some prospective employers have been asking candidates to share with them their appraisal summary. The LLMC view supported by colleagues on the GPC, is that this is unacceptable practice.

Knowing that one's appraisal might be used as evidence for a future interview could potentially undermine the benefits of self-reflection and transparency and therefore the purpose of appraisal as a developmental tool.

GP appraisal documentation is highly privileged information with restricted access for specific purposes only, relating to the Medical Register, Licensing and Performers' list requirements.

Knowing that one's appraisal might be used as evidence for a future interview could potentially undermine the benefits of self-reflection and transparency and therefore the purpose of appraisal as a developmental tool.

It is reasonable that the potential employer requests evidence of regular appraisal and date of revalidation and this could be the screen shot of the appraisal page on Clarity that shows appraisal dates.
