Welcome to our first news update for 2020.

We know that it has been a hard year for the NHS and for General Practice in particular. We want everyone to remember that the LMC is here to support you if you ever need it. 1. PCN DES

Thank you to everyone who responded to the survey, where 88% of the feedback stated that the NHS E&I draft specifications would decrease PCN stability and 94% saying that they would decrease practice financial stability. At a subsequent GPC meeting where an emergency motion to hold a Special Conference of LMC representatives received overwhelming support. We let you have more details on the conference once arrangements have been made.

2. Supplementary Network Services (SNS)

The LMC are negotiating the SNS contract to ensure it is fit for purpose to stabilise Waltham Forest general practice.

3. Reverting to GMS contract

Many practices in Waltham Forest will no longer receive transition payments from April 2020 and we wondered if you have considered reverting to a GMS Contract? The GMS contract offers greater stability and security than PMS agreements and not subject to local negotiation. The BMA has produced a <u>PMS GMS comparison</u> <u>document</u>, which you may find useful or you could contact the GP Support Team at Londonwide LMC (<u>GPSupport@lmc.org.uk</u>).

4. Digital First update

Practice/patient improvements -NHS England London region mandate for all practices to offer online consultation by April 2020. LMC currently in discussion with NEL STP teams and have raised need to invest in change management and mapping of different clinical/IT systems. LMC will continue to meet with NEL STP to establish how practices will be supported with offering online consultation to patients including exploration of patients/service users decision making.

7. LMC achievements for 2019:

We thought we we'd start by updating on the LMC highlights from last year:

Safeguarding reports

Agreement has been reached for the completion of reports and a Safeguarding LIS will be rolled out across NEL from April. Negotiations are still taking place on the date when payment should start and we ask that you keep records of all completed safeguarding reports as there is a possibility of backdated payments.

Off licence medication requests

Agreement was reached with NELFT where GPs will no longer be asked to prescribe mental health drugs off licence. Please inform the LMC if you receive any further requests.

8. Direct Booking of 111

Discussions are taking place as patients could be booked in without being clinically assessed.

9. Access to online records

Patient access to online records will come into effect from April and there are concerns on risks and the ability of redaction system. We will be working with NHS England and LMC Law to reach a solution.

The NHS App provides a simple and secure way to access a range of healthcare services on your smartphone or tablet. Developed by NHS Digital and NHS England, it is fully integrated in all EMIS and TPP practices across England. Once registered, patients can:

- Check their symptoms using NHS 111 and the symptom checker
- Book and manage appointments at their GP practice
- Order their repeat prescriptions
- Securely view their GP medical record
- Register as an organ donor

• Choose whether the NHS uses their data for research and planning
